**“Building and Sustaining
Membership”**
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By the time you receive this mailing the National Officer's will have sent out information packets pertaining to their program to all the Department Program Chairmen, NEC women, and non-Department contacts. This information is to be shared with the membership. If you haven't heard from your Department Chairman or NEC woman regarding the theme of the National Officer's, or their suggestions and ideas to enhance programs, please contact them and ask that they forward this information to you. The National Officer's mailing, along with the National Lines articles, are intended to be additional resources to support your program activities. Please let us know if you find them useful or if there is other information that would be helpful for National Officer's to share that could build your programs.

My theme for the year is **“Building and Sustaining Membership.”** You've heard how renewals are declining, fewer ladies are becoming members, and our overall membership totals are declining. Our membership is the brick and mortar of our Auxiliary. We need to find ways to keep members as well as gain new ones.

At our National AMVETS Ladies Auxiliary convention this past August an incentive program for increasing renewals was introduced. There are four classes based upon current Department membership totals. The classes are as follows: Class A: 30-350 members; Class B: 351-700 members; Class C: 701-2,500 members; and Class D: 2,501 – or more. Departments in each category that have the largest percentage of renewals will be awarded \$250 at our National Executive Committee Meeting. In the event of a tie the monies will be shared between the two Departments. Percentage will be based upon renewals by 12/31/16 and received at National Headquarters by January 31, 2017.

Another incentive that was approved by your National Executive Board was for the reimbursement of up to \$100 to Departments to offset the cost of Local Membership Awards. The request for reimbursement is to be sent (via mail or email) by the Department to National Headquarters with a description of the awards presented, who the award was given to (Auxiliary or Auxiliary member) and the dollar amount of the award.

This past August I had the opportunity of going to our National Headquarters to observe how membership is processed. It was an informative experience. I watched Sonja enter information regarding new members, renewed members, transferred and deceased members into the database. Besides being an electronically awkward and cumbersome process I developed a greater appreciation for what the Headquarters staff face in terms of information received, or not received. Frequently when the information on a renewed or transferring member was entered into the database, a different address came up. There is a form on our AMVETS National Auxiliary website (and sent to Department Chairmen, NEC women and non-Department contacts) that is to be used to provide information regarding a change of address. When submitting Dues & Renewals please be mindful that if there has been a change of address, a Change of Address form needs to be sent in. Do not presume that National Headquarters staff knows which address to use for a member if there are different addresses listed on the Dues & Renewals form than what they already have in the data system. The

Revalidation, Dues & Remittance, Transfer and Change of Address forms are separate documents; each serves a purpose. Whenever there is a change of address, the proper form needs to be sent to National Headquarters. I know that this may seem to be a redundant process but it does provide Headquarters staff with a check and balance system.

Over the months ahead please remember, your National Officers are **your** elected representatives for our AMVETS Ladies Auxiliary. We work for you and we need to hear from you. We are here to support you and determine how we can do better. Your ideas, thoughts and comments matter!

Our National President, Ms. Evelyn, wants to make this a rock'n year. Let's do our part by **"Building and Sustaining Membership!"**

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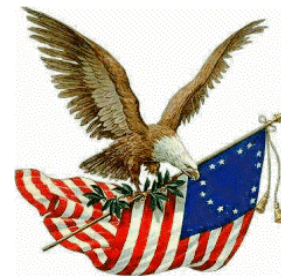

The Local Chaplain shall retain one (1) copy and forward three (3) copies to the Department Chaplain. The Department Chaplain retains one (1) copy and sends one (1) copy to the National Chaplain and one (1) copy to National Headquarters. Additional copies will be made as required according to the Department and Local By-laws.
2. Make sure to include a next of kin if known and note if the member is a PNP or PDP.
3. Please **do not hold the deceased notices**. Send them in as soon as received.

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To All Department Parliamentarians, Department Presidents and NEC women:

At the **August 2016** National Convention in Reno, Nevada several changes were made to our Constitution.

1. The term stepdaughter was clarified: A stepdaughter must have been a dependent of an AMVET or deceased Veteran prior to their eighteenth (18th) birthday.
2. Department Bylaws are due to the National Parliamentarian by **July 15th**.
3. It was also voted on that Departments will determine term limits for officers. We have removed that the Department Presidents cannot be re-elected. It will be up to the Departments to determine if a President can or cannot be reelected.
4. When a Local charter is cancelled, surrendered or forfeited, you must notify National Headquarters.

Also under **Donations**: milk/plastic caps can be recycled at a value of 5 cents. We have removed the Betty Crocker coupons because they are no longer a program.

The Revised Constitution, Bylaws and Manual are now available for purchase, please contact National Headquarters or use the order form that be found either on-line or in this edition of the National Lines. New officers and new members will find the manual a valuable resource!

All applications must be postmarked no later than July 1 and sent to AMVETS National Ladies Auxiliary Headquarters - Attention: National Scholarship Officer.

Who are Junior AMVETS: The Junior AMVETS are the sons, daughters, stepchildren, brother, sisters and grandchildren of AMVETS, deceased members of AMVETS, member of the Auxiliary, members of the Sons of AMVETS, and service members who died and would have been eligible for AMVETS membership, including all children that have legal guardian of and who are five through seventeen years of age.

What is Junior AMVETS: Junior AMVETS organize Youth Programs, Americanism Programs, Drill Teams, Service Programs, and assist the AMVETS and AMVETS Ladies

Auxiliary organizations in their Service Programs. Junior AMVETS is organized on the local, State, and National Levels.

How is a Junior AMVETS Local Post Formed? Local Junior AMVETS Posts can be eight eligible new members that complete the application process through the AMVETS post or a combination of posts. Application for a charter shall be forwarded to the State Department of AMVETS for their approval and processing and then to the National Ladies Auxiliary Junior AMVETS Coordinator.

Our National Junior AMVETS President has chosen PAWS With a Cause® for her project this year and her theme is “They are more than your four-legged friend”. Please support our Junior President’s Project.

I will be working on updating the National Junior AMVETS Award Donor information, as well as working on getting the Junior AMVETS forms back on the AMVETS National website.

Some helpful hints:

- ❖ Pick a theme and carry it through the book
- ❖ Include dates on newspaper clippings
- ❖ If your Table of Contents lists page numbers, remember to number your pages'
- ❖ Double and triple check that your mandatory items are in order
- ❖ Bigger is not necessarily better!
- ❖ Follow the Mandatory Criteria order exactly!
