SUBJECT: UPCOMING DEADLINE DATES

Beginning this week, Auxiliary National Headquarters goes on their summer schedule and the office will close every Friday at 2:00pm throughout September. Also the Convention Digest is in the mail.

Here's a list of upcoming deadline dates for May, June and July:

MAY

Membership to be included in year-end totals and delegate strength **MUST** be **postmarked** by **May 31**. Please check with your Department for their deadline date so membership can be submitted to National Headquarters on time.

JUNE

Year-end NEC reports are due to the National Service Chairmen **postmarked** by **June 1**.

Membership Awards listed in the Convention Digest due to the National 1st Vice President **postmarked** by **June 15**.

NEC Reports for inclusion to the National Convention book are **DUE June 30th**. The outgoing NEC shall prepare the Department report for National Convention. It is preferred that your report is sent via email (cking@amvets.org) and in WORD format.

ALL membership for the 2015 – 2016 membership year – **postmarked** by **June 30**. This will allow processing so a pre-print card will be received. Any membership received after June 30 will **NOT** be processed until after National Convention. It is our goal to have the membership file to the printer for processing/shipping prior to National Convention

JULY

Local Revalidations are due postmarked by **July 1**. Department Revalidations are **due July 1** however a five (5) day grace period shall be allowed if the convention is held during the last weekend in June.

National Convention Pre-registration - **postmarked** by **July 1**. Delegate registration will be accepted on-site at the higher rate of \$45.00.

Scholarship applications – **postmarked** by **July 1**.

Patron's Page submissions - **postmarked** by **July 1**.

Resolutions, Recommendations and Amendments (2 copies) to the National Parliamentarian **postmarked** by **July 1** with one (1) copy to National Headquarters.

Convention Book ads – **postmarked** by **July 1**.

Blood Donor/Drive submissions to the National 3rd Vice President – **postmarked** by **July 1**.

Colors/Page information to the National Sgt. at Arms - **postmarked** by **July 1**.

Hotel Reservation cut-off date for The Nugget is **July 3**.

Donations to be included in Convention Book - **postmarked** by **July 15**.

Sackette Scholarship applications **due** to the National Sackette Scholarship Chairman prior to **July 15**.

Honors and Awards submissions or History/Scrapbooks mailed to National Headquarters - **postmarked** by **July 15**.

Convention Training Seminar form/fee - **postmarked** by **July 29**. Training registration will be accepted on site.

As summer approaches there are several ways that we can continue to support our Child Welfare program. Donations to John Tracy Clinic, the leading diagnostic center for children with hearing impairment, are always appreciated throughout the year. While on site programming will be concluding for the summer, international parent toddler and preschool summer programs will be offered during the month of July. John Tracy Clinic will also be hosting a summer celebration and annual picnic on July 24th. Besides John Tracy Clinic, there are other projects to consider. For example, as part of your Department Convention you might consider having each local Auxiliary put together a layette that can be donated to a child welfare social service agency in the community that your convention is being held. These items can include diapers, wipes, formula, and infant and children's clothing to families in need. A great way to obtain items would be to have a “Fill the Crib” event by asking a local grocery store to allow you to set up a pack n play or even just some tables outside their store and give customers a slip of paper explaining who you are and where the items will be donated. It's a win win for both the store and your project!

Local and Department Auxiliaries can help to provide financial and material support to children's sports teams. Teams always can use shirts and equipment. Maybe your Auxiliary could provide snacks or sport drinks for a sporting event. Auxiliaries can support bicycling, roller-skating, or skateboarding safety programs. You might also consider working with your local police department to host your own safety program. Summer is an important time for 4H groups. It will be County and State Fair time. Youth often sleep and spend their days in the barns with their animals. Delivering treats to these youth might be a nice way to show our support for their hard work and efforts. Sponsoring a child to go to a camp program is another way we can support children. Day camp and overnight camp experiences provide children with an enriching opportunity to learn make new friends and have fun outside.

Now is also the time to think about the children of our military families. There are special camps such as Camp Corral that works with children whose parent has been wounded or has fallen to war. Here are some websites to learn more information about these camps:

As summer quickly approaches there are many events coming with it such as national holidays including Memorial Day, Flag Day and Fourth of July as well as Department Conventions. In the National AMVETS Ladies manual is a meeting protocol outline along with many ideas for Flag presentations and ceremonies. My theme this year has been on Flag Etiquette and on this website <http://www.usflag.org/flagetiquette.html> there is a lot of helpful information on how to display the flag and other protocols for parades and other events.

As Headquarters continues to prepare for our National Convention, I want to encourage members to please review some of the pertinent information concerning registration, Local Colors and meeting attire:

- Remember to bring your membership card since you will be asked to show it when you register (even if you pre-registered)
- If you plan to send or bring your Local or Department Colors, please review the instructions carefully regarding shipping, responsibility for colors and color bearers.
- Please remember that you need to wear your Convention badge all times on the meeting floor. If you do not have your Convention badge on you may be asked to leave the Convention Floor to go and visit the registration desk (if applicable). Also, no pins other than your state pin are to be worn on your delegate badge. Your state pin needs to be placed in the upper right hand corner away from the printing on the badge.
- While not mandatory, it is always nice to see the ladies in their uniforms at Convention. Uniform guidelines are listed in the Auxiliary Manual please be sure you review it prior to Convention. Just as a reminder, you can wear the Auxiliary hat without wearing the complete uniform. However, if you chose to wear your uniform you must also wear your hat. Also only nice blue jeans are allowed on t-shirt day of Convention. Skinny strap tank tops and shower style flip flops are **not** permitted on the Convention floor.

I want to thank all the ladies that signed up to be on the Page and Uniform Committee for the upcoming convention in Reno. I will be contacting committee members I have listed thus far shortly with some additional information on paging and our plans for the Focus program this year. There is plenty of room still left on the committee so if you are still interested in assisting at Convention, please just send me an email.

If you are planning on attending the Convention please remember to get your rooms booked in advance, air flight reservations made as well as pre-registering it will make your Convention go along much smoother and will help in the accommodations for Department seating.

If you use UPS for mailing entries, make sure they are sent in enough time to arrive at Headquarters by Friday July 15, 2016. We suggest using the US Post Office to make sure your entries are received.
